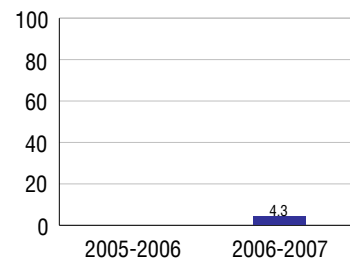

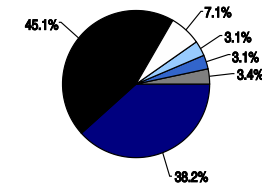

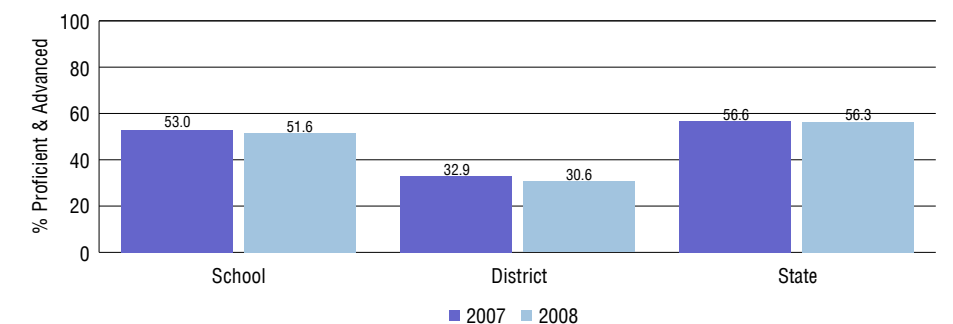
Overall Academic Performance on State Assessments

Percent Proficient and Advanced for Middle Grades for All Content Areas



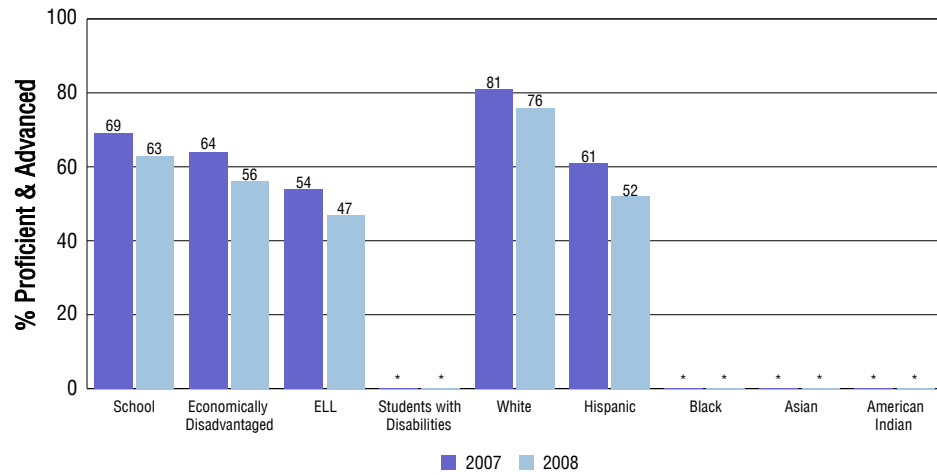

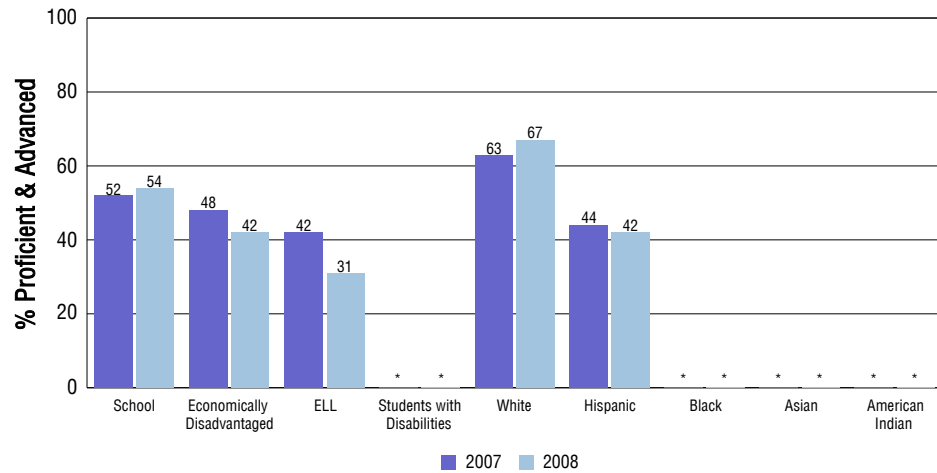

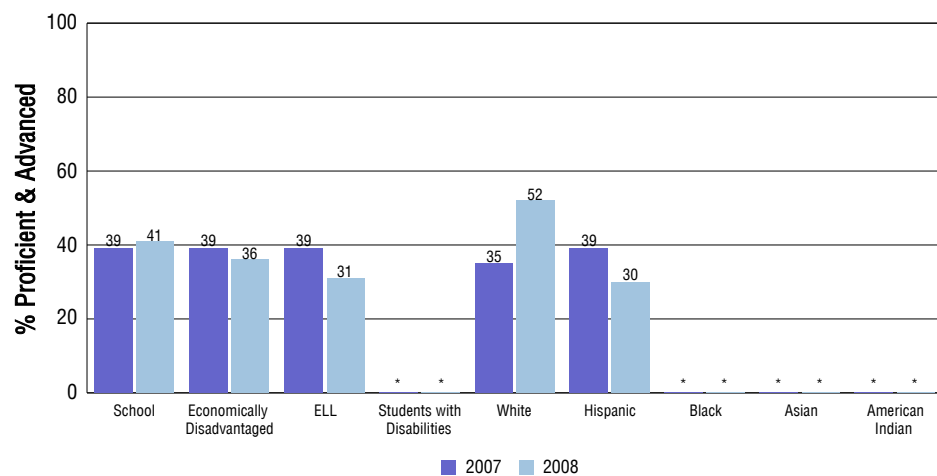
Reading
